






Altered Reality Photography

One should be able to immediately see that the photograph has been creatively manipulated



It looks realistic but cannot be found in the real world

The PSA definition of Creative Altered Reality is as follows:

The image must display a change in color, form, shape or any combination.

All images must be your own.



A computer-generated graphic can be used if original photo content predominates.

Images may not be constructed entirely within a computer.


High Dynamic Range (HDR) images without further changes are not considered "Altered Reality."

How To Get Ideas for Creative Photography??







Keep a digital folder of images you like or want to emulate. Mine is nicknamed, 'Cool Pic Ideas'





Find tutorials and put your 'spin' on a well-known idea or technique. Example, Perspective Bending on the Photoshop Training Channel.





Ask other club members for help. Always share your knowledge and the favor will be returned.



SHOOT FOR THE CLUB THEME! This has advanced my skills more than anything else!



Fix major flaws first

Fix minor flaws – all of 'them!

*Always try to 'borrow' from the photo

Work using simple layers and layer masks

Remove Distractions!

Perfect the imperfections!

Enhance subtly:)

If you want to composite, think ahead and shoot accordingly

LEARN THE PEN TOOL!

Don't be afraid to play with Photoshop – HAPPY ACCIDENTS!

Shoot for the 'Theme' to help creativity!









My Basic Rules

Fix major flaws first (like crop and *straightening)

Don't always rely on the basic straightening tool.

It can be 'straightened' and still 'look' crooked. Try and fix it.

Fix minor flaws

Discover the power of 'Edit', 'Transform'!!

Copy areas to make small layers to fix flaws using 'select', 'copy', 'paste', 'edit' 'transform'

Use different tools to fix smaller flaws

Don't always rely on 'clone' and 'content aware' – They don't always do the job you need

*Always try to 'borrow' from the photo

This decreases problems of different lighting

Makes it easy to blend layers

Makes the edit believable

Work using simple layers and layer masks and stay organized

Once you have layers, they are easy to move, manipulate and blend as needed.

Add simple layer masks to help blend layers by erasing and un-erasing in a non-destructive manner

Remove Distractions!

If you notice it, others will notice it more

Perfect the imperfections!

Be very critical of every imperfection – fix them!

Enhance subtly:)

Find what stands out that looks nice and make it even better!

If you want to composite, think ahead and shoot accordingly

Learn to 'bracket' your shots when shooting the scene Take images of things you think you can use later.

LEARN THE 'PEN TOOL'!

This tool has a large learning curve but is the key to making intricate extractions possible.

Shoot for the 'Theme'!

This pushes you to think outside of the box and to perfect new editing techniques.

Helps you to be creative.

Don't be afraid to play with Photoshop - HAPPY ACCIDENTS!

My Main Photoshop Tools: Copy, Paste, Edit, Transform, Masks to Erase and Un-erase

Select

Copy

Paste (Paste Special) (paste in place)

This allows me to make simple layers



Transform

(scale, rotate, distort, skew, perspective, warp)

This allows me to manipulate a layer in any way I choose

Layer

Layer Mask (Erase / Un-erase)

This allows me to blend in a natural way

1. COMPOSITES!









Things to Remember When Making a Composite

Set up each element using its own layer.

Make a layer mask for each layer

Find a 'selection' tool that you like to make cut outs. I use the Pen Tool.

The best selection tool is the one you like and know how to use.

Include details that make the scene believable, like shadows and lighting.

Take photos of things you may be able to use in 'future' composites.





How I Did it - Main Concepts

Borrowed from the photo

Fixed major distractions (boat on the right). First edit.

Fixed minor flaws (last edit)

PEN TOOL! – to cut out the rigging on ship

Main Photoshop Tools:

Pen Tool to extract subject

Copy, Paste, Edit-Transform

Layer Masks – to hide and blend the borrowed components

Added 'Moon' to the image behind the cutout

A. Fix Major Flaw

I borrowed from the image



I selected this component of the image to use to 'hide' the major

distraction on the opposite side.

Photoshop Tools:

Select

Edit

Copy

Paste


Edit
Transform
Flip Horizontally
Move into place on opposite side.





B. Pen Tool to cut out rigging







At this point, my plan was to add a moon and a cool sky



C. Added a Moon





I used a blue colored overlay to help it match and blend in.
















In the end, I decided to use the original sky.

*At the time I created this image, I was not yet using layer masks.

Today, I would!!



Discover the Power of the Pen Tool!

Being able to cut out objects gives you a TON of artistic freedom. It changed my photography editing life!!

Making selections can be frustrating. There are many different ways to select an object in photoshop.

Find a method that works for you, and that you like.

There are tutorials on the pen tool, but if you are having difficulty, have someone show you how to do it.











Applied Principles:

Borrowed surf, seaweed, water and sand from original image

Added components – ship cutout, bottle, and cork

Stars are from a purchased overlay





2. Creating Something From Nothing...



A guitar playing friend showed this first image to me and asked if I could make her something similar...

I thought, ok! How hard can it be??? ...All I need is a stand of trees, a moon, and make a reflection!

I was wrong! It was very hard, and my final image took me on a very long journey.

However, I learned <u>a lot</u> along the way...










A few of the basic image progressions...

I had many, many different progression versions of the image, adding different parts of the images to the overall creation...including a blood moon (in the corner:)







These are just a few samples of my progression. They do not show each progression.









Over 30 layers and layer masks

Final edits were numerous. A few included:

Running the image through a paint program (Dynamic Auto Painter), with greatly reduced effects, to bring a more 'painted' look and color to the overall image. NIK filters and masking to increase clarity and details.

Finding and repairing defects.

Adding details to improve the overall aesthetics of the image.

Main editing tools: Copy, Paste, Edit, Transform, masks to erase and un-erase




I wasn't happy with the original result, so I tried to fix it!






I 'borrowed' from the original image to add length to the right side


How I Fixed It!






I also borrowed water 'pieces' to fill in the space


Layers of 'water' I borrowed from the source image



Shows added water pieces that need blending and fixes




Square Crop



I used this technique to make the sky






Editing Steps:

Set Radial Blur to Zoom, Best, 100%

...and have more fun by rotating it! :)












These are the original 2 images I used for the composite







Manipulating the image to 'make' a lens ball



I copied part of the image




I made a lens ball with the elliptical marquee tool and then painted it

I used Select, Edit, Copy, Paste, Transform, Warp, then **Fisheye** (found under 'Custom)' to make the image fit into the lens ball.

Layer Mask - used to erase edges

I also added a shadow to the bottom.





I used a mask to erase the edges to help it look like a real lens ball.




